Maths

We will revisit previous learning on a daily basis to improve our fluency.

The children in Year 3 will build on prior knowledge of Mass & Capacity as well as revisiting and extending their knowledge and understanding of Fraction, Money, Time and Statistics. Children working at a Year 4 level will develop their understanding of position and direction and decimals as well as Money, Time and Statistics.

Children will have access to a wide range of diagrams, pictures and equipment to secure their understanding. Puzzles and problems will be regular feature of learning, including word problems. Key concepts from earlier in the year will be revised and consolidated.

English

Stone Age Boy by Satoshi Kitamura — We will be using this adventure story to develop our own writing skills, constructing sentences that engage and intrigue the reader as well as writing direct speech, punctuated with inverted commas. This fictional story will also help us to explore life in the Stone Age, which we will deepen further in our History work.

Non chronological reports – We will use our knowledge of the Stone Age, Mountains and Rocks and Soils to create informative non fiction work that includes the key features of non fiction texts.

Watermill production - We will be developing our performance skills such as. using appropriate intonation, volume, and movement so that our meaning is clear.

Grammar, spelling and punctuation skills will include improving our fluency of previous skills, developing a greater understanding of adverbial phrases, suffixes and prefixes.

Reading is an essential part of learning in Pheasant class and we enjoy our daily guided and independent reading times. Additional reading for pleasure at home will continue to support the development of reading and comprehension skills.
