We continue our in-depth learning journey of fractions and move on to decimals. Children will really get to grips with what these difficult concepts mean. We will also learn to calculate and build on prior knowledge of Position & Direction, Volume, Converting Units and Negative numbers.

Children will have access to a wide range of diagrams, pictures and equipment to secure their understanding.)Puzzles and problems will be regular feature of learning, including word problems. Key concepts from earlier in the year will be revised and consolidated.
